World pandemic affects us all The League maintains community connections

Community access to food was (and still is) of great concern to our group, especially the most vulnerable populations: seniors and children. The League did something about it.

As soon as we closed The Shop in March, we realized that our local IGA would be hit by our sudden lack of weekly shopping for milk and other foods. We also thought that local seniors were going

to be affected by all of the changes and stay-at-home orders. In an effort to help both, the board voted to buy 25 \$40 **IGA gift cards** (\$1000) to be handed out to senior shoppers. The Manager, Mike Morrison, was able to help us by randomly giving out the cards during the store's senior (early) shopping hours. Each time a customer was given one, he told them it was paid for my Marietta Welfare League. We heard back from a few of those senior shoppers and all were so thankful!

MWL also donated \$1000 to local restaurant, <u>Joe</u> <u>Momma's Kitchen</u> and their senior meals program.

JMK owners Sara and Eric Sauls created and delivered meals to seniors in need for weeks during the initial quarantine period. (You may have heard their story mentioned in Gov.

DeWine's televised updates earlier this year.) Two hundred (200) people in Washington County were able to have a free meal from our donation. Many local people and businesses donated to this project and *overall* 7,680 *meals* were delivered to seniors... All at no cost to them!! Check out

our member involvement stories to see who helped deliver too.

<u>GoPacks</u> is a program spreading through Marietta City Schools that feeds children in need. MWL donated \$1000 to this program to buy food distributed to Washington County kids!

We are proud to have been even a small part of these programs. We are even prouder to be a part of a community where so many people all over the area stepped up and helped... and are still helping.

Fall Auction Cancelled, Need is Still Great

The annual Fall Auction has been cancelled for 2020. As most of you know, normally the money raised at the annual event goes to fund The Shoe Tag program. This program has been around since 1938 and allows Washington County children the ability to get new shoes. Currently Shoe Tag vouchers have a \$35 value each. Last year, we helped nearly 600 children!

Without an auction event to gather supporters this year, the committee has decided to try a direct approach by asking those people who would have normally

attended the social night to donate directly to The Fund. Active League members are encouraged to ask 10 people for \$35 or more, in addition to their regular annual

The Shop is NOW OPEN!

On Saturday, March 14th, Marietta Memorial announced that due to COVID-19 no visitors would be allowed in the hospital. On March 16th, The MWL Board voted to temporarily close The League Shop. Concern for the health and welfare of our volunteers and employees played heavily on the decision to close, as did weighing state and local regulations.

On June 15, we reopened The Shop. The hospital installed shields (pictured on the right) between the customers and the register area. The local health department gave us the limit of 4 customers and 3 employees in The Shop space at one time. We have instituted a mask policy for all people in our shop (customers and employees alike). Currently, we are not having any volunteers work behind the counter. Volunteers are still shopping at Sam's Club and IGA, as well as working on gifts and other behind the scenes activities.

We initially reopened with shorter hours and are reevaluating our schedules and offerings as time goes on.

As of July 28, 2020 The League Shop hours Monday – Thursday: 8 a.m. - 4 p.m.

News & Updates



While we were closed:

During The Shop closure our group was still very active. The Board met via Zoom multiple times, constantly evaluating how and when we could open back up safely.

The Board voted to <u>pay our employees</u> an average of their paychecks for two pay periods after the initial closure. At the end of this time, the new and expanded state unemployment guidelines had been issued and the board voted to furlough our employees and help them apply for the special government unemployment assistance. We also sent out **two rounds of grocery gift cards** to help employees, offered assistance with paperwork, and maintained connections.

Our commitment to Memorial Health System: The Memorial Health Foundation reached out to us to help purchase a **CEPHEID Molecular Lab Module and 1BS -2 Hood.** This critically important equipment allows COVID-19 tests to be processed right here in Washington County. Instead of 5-7 days, test results can be achieved in 45 minutes! On top of that, this equipment can be used for 8-10 other tests including the BRCA genetic testing helpful in Breast Cancer diagnosis.

This major issue was taken to our general membership for an online vote in mid April. The group voted to give \$10,000 to this urgent cause.

Susan Strauss took charge of an effort to show our support and appreciation for the Nursing Staff at MMH. On May 6 (during Nurse Appreciation Week), The League donated pizzas to both day and night shifts. Working with three different restaurants and MMH Volunteer Services, 110 hot pizzas were delivered to deserving and grateful nurses.

Our members have been balancing work and home life in drastically different ways than before. Many have turned their homes into classrooms for online schooling or transitioned dining room tables into work offices and virtual meeting hubs. Some have taken on the task of grocery shopping for neighbors or other families. Members have contributed to stimulate the economy by ordering takeout from local restaurants (and started to return to the dining rooms lately). Some donated funds to the MOV Tip Jar to help offset the loss of wages for local wait staff and bartenders. Each and every one of us has been doing our very best. (Even if that means calling friends and loved ones on the phone or via FaceTime instead of seeing them in person. Or sharing a good news post on social media or just turning OFF the onslaught of constant news to relax and simply be.)
